Introduction

Developing and maintaining a graduation and post-graduation plan for yourself will assist you in exploring your interests, skills, values and personal traits while considering many career pathways available to you in Saskatchewan, Canada and beyond! This will guide you in making informed decisions that will impact your present and future lives. A graduation and post-graduation plan is a tool to assist you in transitioning smoothly through high school and beyond – to a future that is personally fulfilling and rewarding.

Grade 11 graduation & post-graduation plan checklist:

- Review and obtain personal documentation. *These documents should not be uploaded to myBlueprint for privacy reasons.*
- Birth certificate
 - Health Card
 - Social Insurance Number
 - Saskatchewan Photo ID
 - Driver's Licence
- Review and obtain employment related documents
 - WHMIS Certificate
 - Food Safety Level I
- Complete inventories
 - Complete Motivations inventory and write a reflection about the results. Add this to your About Me Portfolio - Grade 11. to further identify interests and passions and develop a description of the person you want to become.
- Review Grade 12 course options to understand what a tentative schedule may look like for completion in order to gain understanding of prerequisites to courses and graduation requirements.
- Create one academic, personal and career goal per semester to work towards. These goals will be discussed at 3-Way conferences.
- Review the RBE Post-Graduation Overview document with a trusted adult

- Post Secondary
 - Attend at least one scholarship and student loan information session offered at your school
 - Attend at least one post-secondary information session offered at the school. Gain further understanding of post-secondary opportunities and conduct a comparison of programs.
- Trades/Apprenticeship
 - Complete Level II of your SYA Passport this year
 - Attend at least one post-secondary information session offered at the school.
 - Attend at least one scholarship information session offered at the school
- Employment
 - If you are taking Workplace 20, upload completion of *Financial Literacy* Chapter Test
 - Search for at least 3 part-time jobs using the Saskjobs.ca website
- Continue developing basic budgeting skills and identify strategies for making wise financial choices, while discovering how post-graduation choices will affect current budget goals.
- Continue to develop personal career documentation

- Resume & Cover letter
- Meet with a trusted adult at least once regarding your post-secondary plans
- Attend the Regina Public Schools Career Day at CRP to gain insight into a variety of career pathways.

Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship

Welcome to the Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) Program! SYA raises awareness of apprenticeship in Saskatchewan schools by helping young people discover what rewards come with being a Youth Apprentice and working in the skilled trades. SYA enhances student career development by exploring the world of opportunities skilled trades offer Saskatchewan youth. SYA is composed of three levels with four challenges in each level to be completed in Grades 10 to 12.

What are the benefits of completing SYA in high school?

Students who complete all three levels and register as an apprentice in a designated trade within five years receive the following benefits:

1. waiver of registration fee (currently \$175)
2. no charge for first level of technical training tuition
3. 300 hours of trade time credit

Grade 11 Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Level II Tasks:

- Successful completion of at least 1 PAA course
- Complete an interview with a journeyperson
- Complete one of the following
 - Design and display a possible career pathway chart for a trade
 - List the 4 basic steps to obtain a journeyperson
- Explore a web-based resource connected to apprenticeship

Record your Progress:

It is important that you record your progress and the completion of the above tasks in order to receive credit for Level I of Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship.

1. Select **Portfolios** from the tab menu in the home section.
2. Add a new portfolio (+ **Add Portfolio**) titled '**SYA LEVEL II**'. This portfolio will allow you to record your completed tasks for this level.

If you are attending CRP:

- Be sure to update your myBlueprint portfolio with any assignments or certificate you complete during your course.
- Please inform your CRP teachers that you have chosen to register with SYA and are working toward completing your passport assignments.

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Exploring the Fine Arts
