## Junior Girls Volleyball

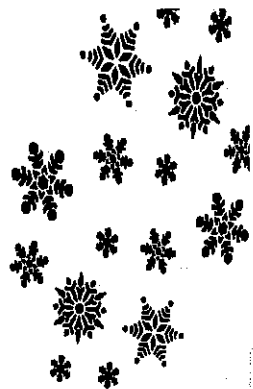

**SCHOOL FLUORIDE MOUTH RINSE PROGRAM**

Dear Parent/Guardian,

I regret to inform you that the Fluoride Mouthrinse Program in Saskatchewan will be phased out or discontinued indefinitely, as the USA supplier is no longer shipping to Canada. We are looking at other options and you will be notified if we can supply an alternate method of fluoride to the school your child attends.

In the meantime, please continue to exercise other preventive options i.e., fluoridated toothpaste, fluoride varnish at the dental office and over the counter weekly fluoride rinses from the pharmacy.

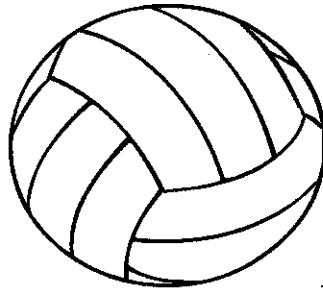
