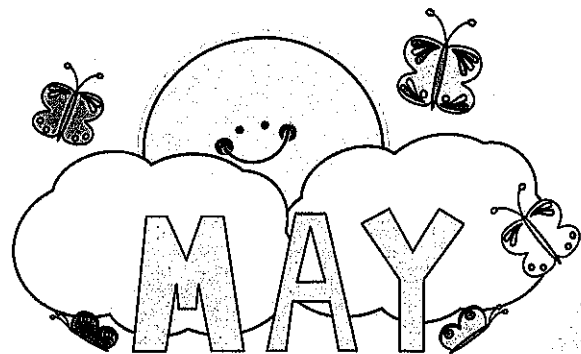

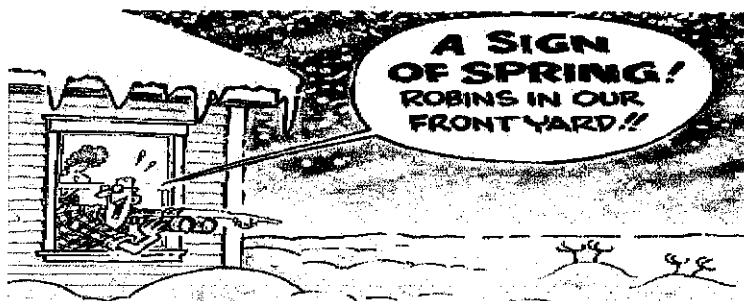

Raleigh Davies and Langston in Solo Piano, Voice and Speech Arts classes. They received first places in their respective classes and also received many scholarships and awards.



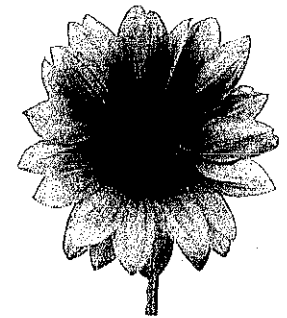
## Glaslyn Sr. Drama

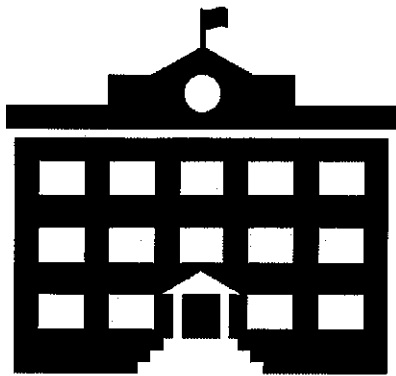

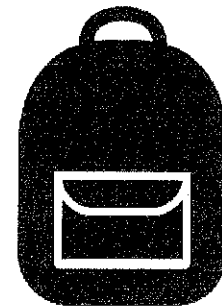
