Reading TIPS for Parents of First Graders

Give your child lots of opportunities to read aloud. Inspire your young reader to practice every day! The tips below can help your child become a happy and confident reader.

- **Don't leave home without it!** Bring along a book any time your child has to wait, such as at a doctor's office. Always try to fit in reading.
- **Once is not enough.** Encourage your child to reread favorite books and poems. Rereading helps kids read more quickly and accurately.
- **Dig deeper into the story.** Ask your child about the story you've just read. Say something like, "Let's have a story conversation. What happened in the beginning, middle and end of the story? Who are the characters? Where does the story take place (setting)?"
- **Be patient.** When your child is trying to figure out an unknown word, give him/her time to do so. Remind your child to use the picture, look at the first letter or letters, or read on to try to figure out the unknown word.
- **Pick books that are at the right level.** Help your child pick books that are not too difficult. The aim is to give your child lots of successful reading experiences.
- Play word games. Have your child sound out words as you change it from *mat* to sat; sat to sag to sap; and from sap to sip.
- I read to you, you read to me. Take turns reading aloud at bedtime. Kids enjoy this special time with parents.
- **Gently correct your young reader.** When your child makes a mistake, gently point out the letters he or she overlooked or read incorrectly.
- Talk, talk, talk and write, write, write. Talk and write with your child on a daily basis. Add interesting vocabulary words into your conversations. When writing, encourage your child to use the letters and sound patterns he/she is learning at school.

Our Easter break this year will be from **April 7th –16th.** Students will return back to school on **April 17th.**




SECOND STEP

- Solving problems safely and respectfully helps us get along better with others.




MaraFun
