## Highlight 1: NWSD Graduation Rates Continue to Trend Upward

## Key Messages:

The 2021-22 graduation rate for the NWSD was 84%, above the provincial average of 76%. This number is the same as last year but is higher than the division average prior to 2019-20. NWSD graduation rates for all three categories are above the provincial averages. The increase in graduation rates from pre-pandemic levels overall is attributed to the improved FNMI (First Nations, Métis & Inuit) graduation rate. The FNMI graduation rate was close to 70% in 2021-22 which is markedly higher than it was in 2011-12 when it was 47%. There is still a significant gap between non-FNMI and FNMI graduation rates, however, the gap is closing at a consistent rate. NWSD policies regarding instruction and supports have been instrumental in moving this number upward.

### Highlight 2: Severe Weather Procedure Amended for Transportation

#### Key Messages:

The NWSD has changed the practice for inclement weather days. Effective **Monday, January 16, 2023** if a rural bus route is cancelled for inclement weather, it will no longer be a full day cancellation. If a bus is cancelled in the morning, it is expected that it will operate in the afternoon to bring any students home that may have gone to school that day. Buses will run after school unless temperatures remain below the threshold of -40 or -45 with the windchill or existing hazardous road conditions persist.

This change is being made to help support students and families.

#### Highlight 3: NWSD Celebrations

Ribbon Skirt & Shirt Day

The first National Ribbon Skirt Day was January 4, 2023, and NWSD schools marked the day on Friday, January 6. Several schools hosted Ribbon Skirt/Shirt making workshops, with the support of local Elders and Knowledge Keepers. Many students and staff were dressed in beautiful Ribbon Skirts and Shirts to celebrate the day, and staff shared lessons with students about the cultural significance and importance of Ribbon Skirts and Shirts. Thank you to the many staff and volunteers who put on workshops and shared teachings with our students.

### St. Walburg School Refresh

Over the holiday break, St. Walburg School gymnasium got a fresh new look. The facility was repainted from top to bottom and has really brightened the school space.
