Meeting Date: October 16, 2025

North West Teachers' Association – Alan Robins, President; Leighton Chiverton, Vice President

The Board welcomed a delegation from the North West Teachers' Association (NWTA)—Alan Robins, President, and Leighton Chiverton, Vice President. The delegation outlined how the association supports schools and shares information: each school has a School Staff Liaison (SSL) who attends NWTA meetings to relay updates from the executive and the provincial council, the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation (STF), back to staff.

The NWTA representatives also spoke about ongoing recruitment and retention challenges in smaller communities - priority in the Strategic Plan. Finally, they emphasized the importance of targeted professional development and training so teachers have the skills needed for their specific roles.

Transportation Presentation - Gini Calvert, Transportation Supervisor

Transportation Supervisor Gini Calvert briefed the Board on two recent policy updates shared with families—Items on the Bus and Yard Pickup. These guidelines are grounded in SGI provincial regulations and applicable federal transportation regulations, and are detailed in the Bus Parent Handbook available on the division website.

Gini also reported on ongoing efforts to address the bus driver shortage. Strategies include social media and radio advertising, "Try a Bus" experiences at schools, participation in career fairs, and other outreach initiatives.

December Board Meeting Scheduled (Location TBA)

The Board of Education will convene on Thursday, December 11, 2025 (location to be determined). While the board doesn't always meet in December, this additional meeting will provide an opportunity to continue work that advances the 2025–2028 Strategic Plan and the board's annual work plan.

School Enrollments

Overall enrollment has decreased across the school division. For the 2025-2026 school year our full-time equivalent student number is 4,041 (grade 1-12) and the total number of students is 4,160. (The total number of students includes Kindergarten). There are 200 Pre-Kindergarten students in the division, but that program is funded separately, so their numbers are not included in our enrollment.

St. Walburg SCC: Growing Parent & Family Engagement

St. Walburg School's SCC is seeing a surge in interest this year, with more parents and families stepping forward for executive roles and attending meetings. This increased involvement strengthens home–school partnerships, supports school initiatives, and

Daily Phys Ed for Grades 3-9 + Outdoor PE Pilot

HCS has successfully scheduled daily physical education for all Grade 3–9 students—no small feat in a K–12 timetable. They are also piloting an Outdoor Phys Ed class with the Grade 6/7s, giving students more opportunities to explore outdoor activities and enjoy extra fresh air while building lifelong wellness habits.
