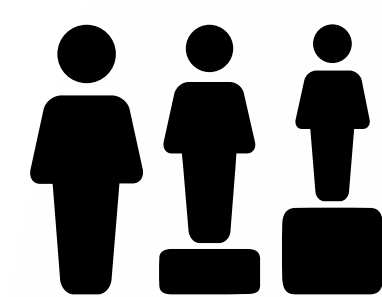

Schools build relationships with local Indigenous communities and organizations.

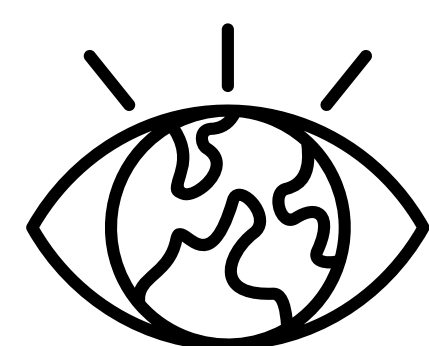
