### **Pictures & Retakes**

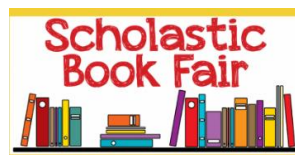

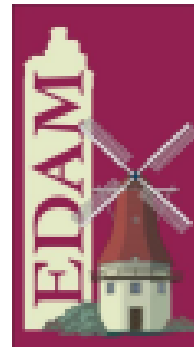
