## Excessive Sugar

Dear HHS Parents and Guardians,

We hope this newsletter finds you well. As part of our ongoing commitment to the well-being of our students, we would like to draw your attention to an important matter regarding their nutrition at school.

Recently, we have observed an increasing trend of students consuming excessive amounts of sugary snacks and beverages during school hours. While we understand that occasional treats are a part of a balanced diet, it is crucial to emphasize the importance of moderation and making healthier choices. Our concern lies in the direct impact it is having in the classroom, as it relates to learning that occurs.

Excessive sugar intake can lead to various health issues, including but not limited to:

1. Reduced Concentration and Focus: High sugar levels can result in energy crashes, making it difficult for students to concentrate on their studies. We are seeing this impact, especially early in the morning, and after lunch. Limiting this unnecessary sugar, and calories will have a direct impact on increased concentration and maintained focus in class.
2. Weight issues: Regular consumption of sugary snacks and drinks can contribute to weight issues, which may have long-term health implications.
3. Dental Problems: Increased sugar intake is associated with a higher risk of dental cavities and other oral health issues.

To address this concern, we kindly request your support in promoting healthier eating habits at school and what your child is spending their money on, when they make choices for themselves. The only way that we can address this, is by working together, school and home.

As a staff, we have also been looking at what we can do to support this within our school as well, and we will continue to look at ways to address this. Together, we can make a change.

## Senior Boys Volleyball - Mrs. Deobald \& Ian McDonald

This year the Senior Boys Volleyball team consisted of 7 players:
Kasen McDonald, Aiden Lascelle, Kye Thom, Graydon Troesch, Beckett Rogers, Kesler Wall and Reid Olson.

Throughout the season these boys attended 4 tournaments:
Maidstone Mega Volley $-4^{\text {th }}$ place
Glaslyn Jets Tourney - $1^{\text {st }}$ place
Turtleford Titan Tourney - $1^{\text {st }}$ place
Home Tourney - $1^{\text {st }}$ place
On November $10^{\text {th }}$ the boys began their playoff run with conference playdowns in Leoville. They finished second place and advanced to regional playdowns.

On November $18^{\text {th }}$ the team travelled to Choiceland to compete in Regional playoffs. There were 6 teams present and the boys played well enough to advance to the next level.

On November 24 \& $25^{\text {th }}$ the boys competed at the SHSAA Provincial Championships in Annaheim and Lake Lenore. It is here that the boys played their best volleyball of the season. The format of the championship is two pools of 5 . Edam was ranked $5^{\text {th }}$ in Pool B , and $9^{\text {th }}$ overall. The boys disagreed with this and proved it. They battled hard to place $2^{\text {nd }}$ in their pool which granted them the crossover match against the $3^{\text {rd }}$ place team, Yellowgrass. They defeated them in 3 sets and were then required to play Rouleau, the first place team (and Gold medal winners) of Pool A. The boys lost in two sets but had the opposition worried. Regardless of the loss, they were able to challenge for the Bronze medal against the home town favorites, Annaheim. The gymnasium was buzzing. The teams split the first two sets which required the third and final set to be played. The boys were down by 8 in the third set when they launched an incredible come back. Unfortunately, they were not able to capture the bronze medal as they fell short by a score of 20-18.

The boys represented Edam and H. Hardcastle School very well. They should be very proud of their performance. It is a weekend they will never forget.

The senior girls hosted a home tournament on Oct. 20-21. We were able to enter 2 teams and Loon Lake, Paradise Hill, and Turtleford rounded out the 5-team round robin tournament. The Grade 9-10 team improved steadily as the tournament progressed. They became more confident on the court and pushed the older teams in some close matches but missed out on the playoff round. The Grade 11-12 team finished first after the round robin and went on to win the tournament defeating Paradise Hill in the final.

The team would like to send out a huge thank you to all the people that worked hard to make the tournament run smoothly. Graydon Troesch and Beckett Rogers did an excellent job officiating the entire tournament. Thank you to the parents that provided food for the canteen, helped with scorekeeping, and stayed to help with clean up at the end of the tournament. Thank you to Mrs. Moriarty and the SRC for providing workers for the canteen and for covering the cost of the first place plaque. ## Road to Provincials

On Nov. 4, the girls traveled to Glaslyn to compete in the 1A Conference Playoffs. To advance to regionals, the girls needed to finish in the top 2 . With only 5 teams, it was a round robin format with no playoffs. All the matches were close, but the girls finished the tournament as conference champions with a 5-0 record. This made them one of the top seeds advancing to regionals.

On Nov. 10-11 the team traveled to Maymont to compete in the 1A Regional Playoffs. Once again, the team needed to finish in the top 2 to advance to the provincial championships. The girls finished first in the round robin defeating Kerrobert and Loon Lake in close matches. This set up a semi-final match with a scrappy Medstead team. The team traded wins, setting up a third and deciding set with the winner advancing to the finals and earning a guaranteed spot at provincials. Things seemed bleak with Medstead jumping out to an 8-1 lead, but the girls battled back and won the set 15-12. In the final, the girls beat a tough Maymont team in 3 close sets to earn the gold medal and the title of Regional Champions!


On Nov. 17-18, team travelled to Annaheim and Watson to compete in the 1A Provincial Volleyball Championships. This was the third consecutive year the team advanced to provincials. With silver and bronze medals at provincials the last two years, expectations were high and hopes of a third provincial medal was the goal. Despite playing hard all weekend, the girls were unable to advance to the playoff round.

There were 58, 1A teams in the province this year, so advancing to Provincials is an accomplishment to be proud of. For Delainee, Kylie, Aleesa, Meadow, and Zoey, this was the end to a very successful volleyball career. Not many students get to experience the success these girls have had with school volleyball. For Brook, Kiana, Amy, Leah, Hailey, Addison, and Madison they gained some valuable experience this year and will be ready to lead the team next season.

Thank you to the players and parents. I couldn't have asked for a better group of people to work with in my last year of coaching volleyball.
