



DIY Snowman Instructions

Kit Contents (ribbon varies)



STEP 1



You can sand the boards or leave them as is for a more 'rustic' snowman before you paint.

STEP 2



Use the paint brush to paint the wooden blocks white. Paint all 6 sides.

This paint is like a chalk paint so you will need to apply a few thin coats.

Let the paint dry fully – you may want to wait until another day to do the other painting.

You can 'rough up' the surface by gently sanding the painted blocks once the paint has dried. (This is optional)

STEP 3 PREPPING THE STENCILS

The blue stencils are covered with a clear piece of transfer tape. You will want to make sure that the tape is firmly pressed onto the blue stencil. You can do this by using your fingernail to press it down.

Then turn it over and carefully peel the white backing off the stencil. (As shown in picture) You will be left with the blue stencil on the sticky transfer tape.



STEP 4 PLACING THE STENCILS

Place the stencil on the wood block where you would like it – be creative! There is no one way that the snowman needs to look.

Once again use your fingernail to press the blue stencil flat and smooth onto the wood block.




STEP 5

Remove the transfer tape very carefully so that the blue stencil remains on the snowman blocks.




STEP 6

Use your fingernail again to press the stencil firmly into the blocks. Any gaps will cause paint to smudge under the stencil.



You can add some masking tape to the edges of the stencil to prevent paint smudging on to the white paint.

But don't worry! If you end up with smudges you can always touch them up afterward 😊



STEP 7

Use the sponges to paint your snowman.
You do not need much paint – put it on in a few thin coats.



STEP 8

Once the paint is dry to the touch, gently and slowly peel off the blue stencil. Be careful not pull it straight off, as you may end up taking some of the paint with the stencil.



STEP 9

Tie the ribbon onto the smallest block. We kept our snowman in 3 pieces, but if you prefer you could use hot glue them together.
