## Principal & Vice-Principal's Message

### Grade 4 OurSCHOOL Survey Goals

**We asked** if students felt they had someone at school who provides encouragement and someone they could turn to for advice.

**They said** 7.5 out of 10 students felt they had someone to turn to for encouragement and support.

**We pledge** to continue providing opportunities to build positive trusting relationships with ALL students at Lakeview.

**We asked** if students feel a sense of anxiety or worry about particular events or social situations.

**They said** 34% of students at Lakeview have moderate to high levels of anxiety.

**We pledge** to immediately address any issues or concerns that are brought to our attention. WE also pledge to continue to provide safe opportunities to discuss and share problems.

**We asked** if students felt important concepts are taught well and class time is used efficiently.

**They said** 8.3 out of 10 students felt that classroom learning time was used effectively and concepts were taught well.

## Reading TIPS for Parents of First Graders

Give your child lots of opportunities to read aloud. Inspire your young reader to practice everyday! The tips below can help your child become a happy and confident reader.

- **Don't leave home without it!** Bring along a book any time your child has to wait, such as at a doctor's office. Always try to fit in reading.
- **Once is not enough.** Encourage your child to reread favorite books and poems. Rereading helps kids read more quickly and accurately.
- **Dig deeper into the story.** Ask your child about the story you've just read. Say something like, "Let's have a story conversation. What happened in the beginning, middle and end of the story? Who are the characters? Where does the story take place (setting)?"
- **Take control of the TV.** It's difficult for reading to compete with TV and video games. Encourage reading as a free-time activity.
- **Be patient.** When your child is trying to figure out an unknown word, give him/her time to do so. Remind your child to use the picture, look at the first letter or letters, or read on to try to figure out the unknown word.
- **Pick books that are at the right level.** Help your child pick books that are not too difficult. The aim is to give your child lots of successful reading experiences.
- **Play word games.** Have your child sound out words as you change it from *mat* to *sat*; *sat* to *sag* to *sap*; and from *sap* to *sip*.
- **I read to you, you read to me.** Take turns reading aloud at bedtime. Kids enjoy this special time with parents.
- **Gently correct your young reader.** When your child makes a mistake, gently point out the letters he or she overlooked or read incorrectly.
- **Talk, talk, talk and write, write, write.** Talk and write with your child on a daily basis. Add interesting vocabulary words into your conversations. When writing, encourage your child to use the letters and sound patterns he/she is learning at school.

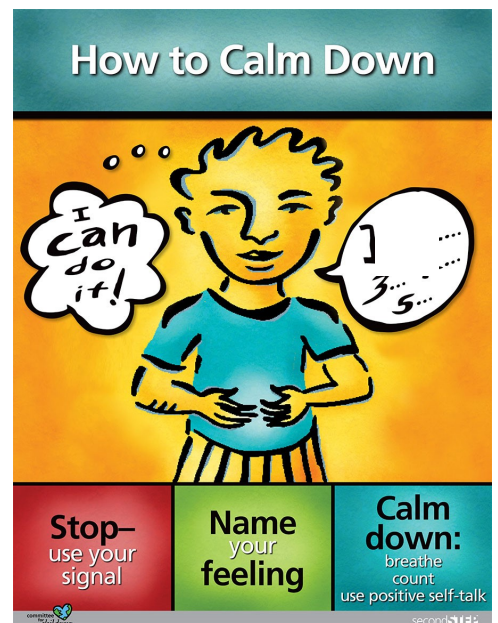
### SECOND STEP

This month, our school-wide theme will continue to focus on **emotion management**. In our morning announcements and classroom lessons, we'll be prompting students to notice their own feelings by paying attention to clues in their bodies, and to use their **Second Step** skills to calm down:

**Stop—Use your signal**  
**Name your feeling**  
**Calm down: Breathe, Count, Use**  
**Positive Self-Talk**

These skills help students calm down strong emotions when faced with learning and social challenges, which helps them succeed academically and get along well with others.

**Second Step** lessons specifically teach about calming down strong emotions such as anger, disappointment, frustration, and anxiety.

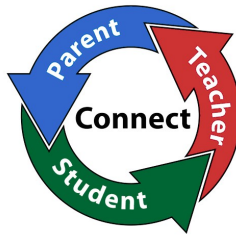
