**Character Education - K & GRADE 1 Listening Skills**

Your child is learning skills to be a good listener.

**Why Is This Important?**

Being good listeners helps children become better learners. Following the Listening Rules helps children listen and pay attention in class.

**Below are the Listening Rules in all Kindergarten and Grade 1 classes:**

**Eyes watching:** Point to the corners of your eyes.

**Ears listening:** Cup your ears with your hands.

**Body still:** Hug your torso with both arms.

**Voice quiet:** Put your finger to your lips.



**MADD SmartWheels**

**SmartWheels** is an elementary school program developed for students in grades 4 to 6 to educate them about the harmful risks associated with alcohol, drug use and impaired driving.

The **Smart Wheels** program is delivered by a MADD Canada Facilitator in a modern, leading-edge and fully equipped mobile classroom. Impactful, on-the-go and self-contained, this mobile classroom is inspiring and empowering young people to make a difference and to be the generation that chooses not to drive impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.



**Smart Wheels** will be at Lakeview on **Oct. 4th**. Our grade 4 students will partake in the presentation.

**Attendance Matters**

Attendance is a key factor in student success! Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 18 days, negatively affects a student's academic performance.



Absences add up: Missing just **2 days a month** means a child misses **10% of the school year**.

**Lunch Bunch**

Mrs. Munroe will be starting Lunch Bunch this month. Grade 4 students who are interested will sign-up and spend time learning about Self-Confidence, Empathy, Kindness as well as other topics. education professionals across the province. We encourage citizens to take some time during this special week to recognize the importance education has on our students and communities.



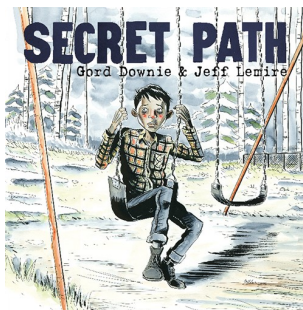
## Take Me Outside Day - Oct. 19
